
Toronto Pearson

Challenges:

- Toronto Pearson is at the heart of the 2nd largest employment zone in Canada, home to more than 300,000 workers
- Businesses cannot attract workers and workers cannot access good jobs around the airport
- Lack of ground connections means there are more than 1 million car trips per day in and out of the airport employment zone
- Goods are stuck in congestion around the airport
- Only 10% of passengers and employees take transit to get to Pearson; the best in the world do much better – Hong Kong 50%; Schiphol 40%; Shanghai 60%

"Union Station West" enables trade diversification and jobs






A new multi-modal transit and mobility hub would:

- provide regional transit network connectivity
- allow for higher value, intensified employment lands
- connect people to jobs and amenities
- free up road and air assets for higher value use
- encourage more sustainable travel modes.
