Air Quality Study Objective

Update emissions inventory, dispersion modeling and human health risk assessment to better quantify and assess the current and projected future air quality (2022 and 2032) associated with and around the airport

Previous studies

- 1990/1991
- 2003/2004
- 2010/2011 (minor internal updates)

Schedule

Phase 1

- Develop airport emissions inventories
- Basically complete



Phase I Results (Preliminary)

2000 Actual – emissions calculated based on actual 2000 activity levels at TPA (2003 report)

2010 Predicted – emissions calculated based on predicted 2010 activity (2003 report)

2011 Actual – emissions calculated based on actual 2011 activity levels at TPA (2014 report)
